Job Title: Apprentice Coach

Employment: Full time – up to 37.5 hours per week

Job Overview:

The role of the Row Nova Scotia (Row NS) Apprentice Coach will be to work closely with the Row NS Provincial Coach, Technical Director, Administrative Staff, and Board of Directors to assist in the development of competitive rowing in Nova Scotia that will continue to make Nova Scotia successful on the National and International stages.

This position will offer one coach in Nova Scotia the opportunity to apprentice with a senior and experienced coach throughout the summer. Through this apprenticeship, the Apprentice Coach will gain valuable practical skills, a formal coach mentorship opportunity, and work towards certification in the RCA Coach stream. The goal of the apprenticeship is to prepare coaches to be a successful club coach and positively impact the club system in years to come; as such, successful applicants are only eligible for the Apprenticeship for one summer.

Responsibilities:

The Apprentice Coach will:

- Work closely with the Technical Director and/or rowing clubs to visit schools and introduce rowing to Junior High School and High School aged athletes;
- Organize and maintain data on the students' anthropometric and DYNO strength testing;
- Identify and contact high potential rowers and direct them to club rowing programs, while offering augmented Learn to Row support to identified high potential rowers;
- Create and train a small group of TID athletes once or twice a week to augment TID athletes' club rowing;
- Work alongside the Provincial Coach to coach small groups of existing Provincial Team athletes;
- Facilitate and manage Provincial Team equipment going to the regattas through the summer and
- Create a personal coaching development and growth plan with their mentor coach.

Qualifications:

The ideal candidate will:

- Hold Canadian citizenship or have the legal right to work in Canada;
- Be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment;
- Have two years experience in rowing, preferably with past coaching experience;
- Have a minimum of NCCP RCA Coach – In Training; and ideally RCA Coach – Trained.
- Have a clean Criminal Record Check and Vulnerable Sector Check;
- Have a current First Aid and CPR certificate or a plan to acquire this in the next two months;
